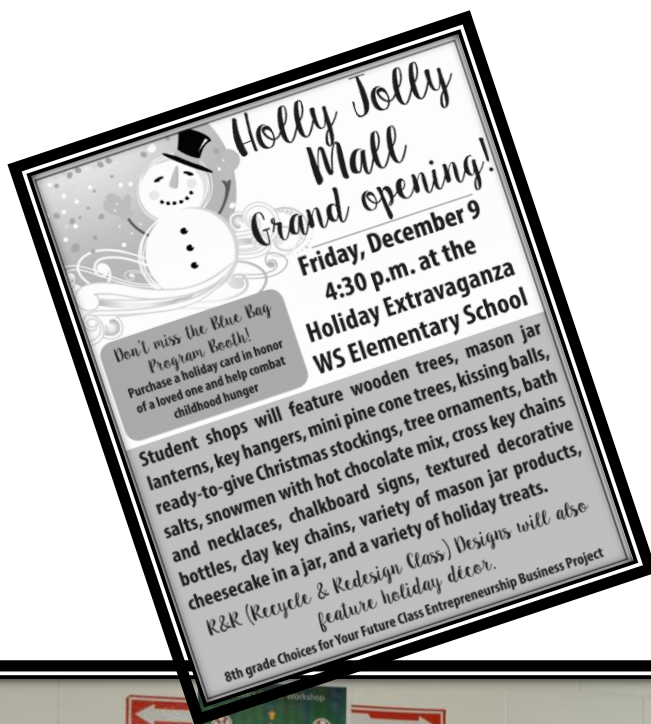


Financial Fitness Wessington Springs Junior High FCCLA Chapter 2016-2017
